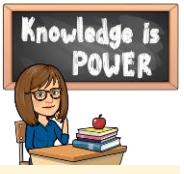

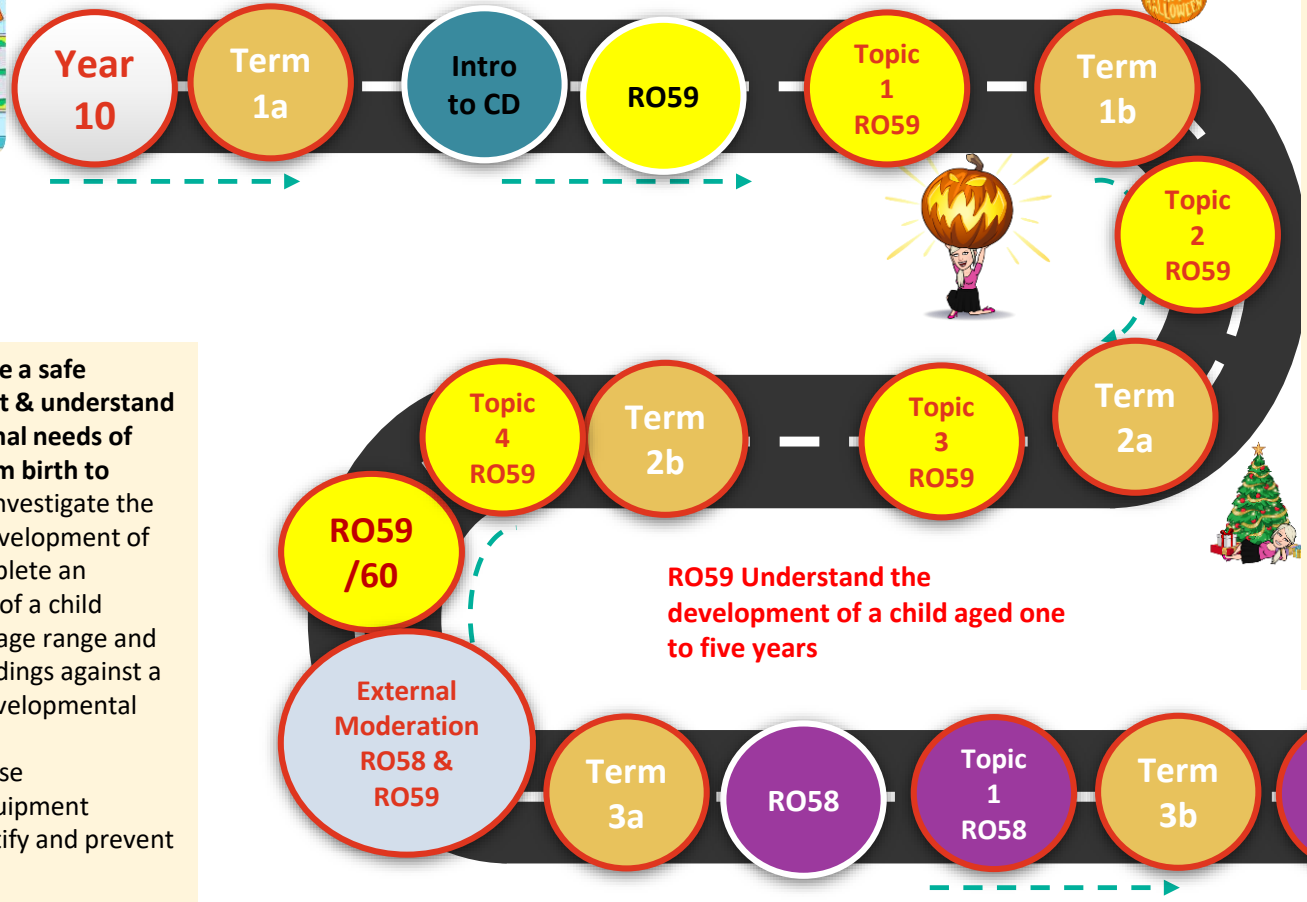
The Journey Starts

Introduction to Child Development

Plagiarism, Referencing, Command Words, NEA work.

In both RO58 and RO59 there are 4 topics per component to be taught. You will have deadlines to meet and this work will form 60% of your final grade.



RO59 Understand the development of a child from one to five years
 You will investigate the expected development of a child, complete an observation of a child and compare findings against a specified developmental norm.
 TA1: Physical, Intellectual and Social Developmental Norms from one to five years
 TA2 :Stages and types of play and how play benefits development
 TA3: Observe the development of a child aged one to five years
 TA4: Plan and Evaluate play activities for a child aged one to five years for a chosen area of development

RO58- Create a safe environment & understand the nutritional needs of children from birth to 5 You will investigate the expected development of a child, complete an observation of a child within a set age range and compare findings against a specified developmental norm.

 Task 2: identify and prevent accidents

 Task 4: plan prepare and evaluate a feed or meal choice

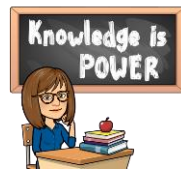

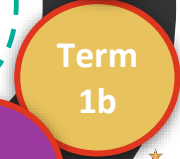

These are internally marked, but externally moderated. The tasks change each year so you need to get it right first time.



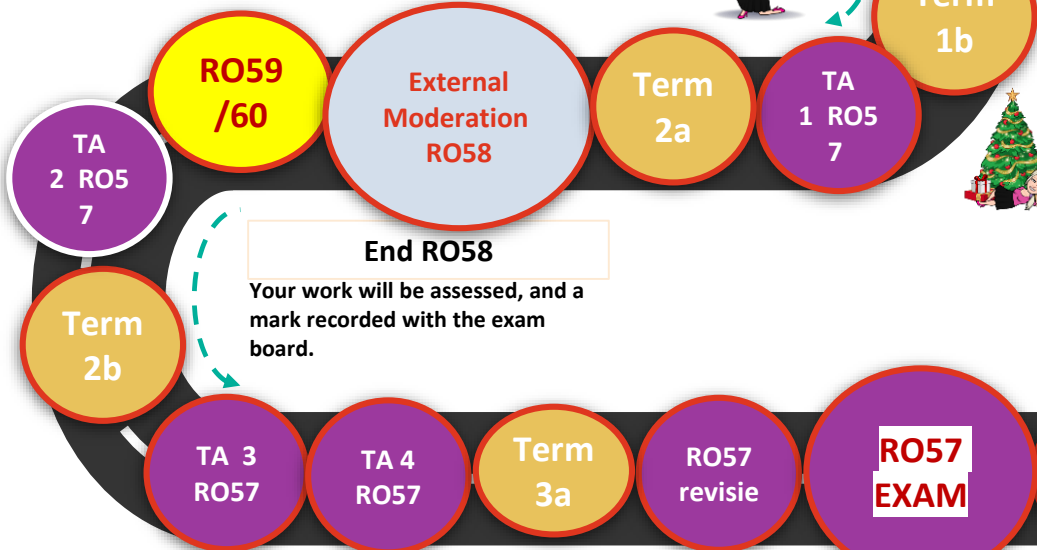
In RO58 there are 4 topics to be taught followed throughout the NEA assessment. You will have deadlines to meet and this work will form 30% of your final grade.
