KEY STAGE THREE

N/B The following guidelines apply to the majority of students.

For year 7, only English, maths and science will set homework up to October half term.

Subjects which have the most lessons per week (English, Maths & Science) will set homework on a weekly basis.

Subjects which have 2 or 3 lessons per week (French*, Geography & History) will set homework on a two-weekly basis.

Subjects which have 1 lesson (or 1 practical double-lesson) per week will set homework on a three-weekly basis. These subjects are biology, chemistry, physics, art, guidance, ICT, music, RE & technology

PE homework will be set at the end of each activity unit (approximately every 4-5 weeks)

Teachers will try to stick to this timetable whenever possible but there may be occasions when it would be better for your learning to set the work on a different night.

Students should be given a reasonable amount of time to complete their homework with at least one school day between the setting and handing in of homework, so they can seek help if needed.

- French vocabulary lists will be issued on the weeks when there is no written or on-line homework set.
 These lists of key words are to be learned in time for a mini-test at the start of the next lesson.
- For some KS3 and Es science classes where there is more than one teacher the classes will be set homework on a rotation

KEY STAGE FOUR & FIVE N/B The following guidelines apply to the majority of students.

Subjects which have 3 or 4 or more lessons per week (English, maths & science plus all option choices subjects) will set homework on a weekly or two- weekly basis.

Coursework subjects (Childcare, H&SC, construction, PE, art, photography & graphics) will set homework on a weekly basis and this will usually be a continuation of work which is being completed in class

Teachers will try to stick to this timetable whenever possible but there may be occasions when it would be better for your learning to set the work on a different night.

Also, some work may be expected in the next day but generally this will be the exception to the rule.

*French vocabulary lists will be issued on the weeks when there is no written or on-line homework set. These lists of key words are to be learned in time for a mini-test at the start of the next lesson.

Vocational subjects – Health & Social Care, Child Development, Digital Information & Technology, Sport, Hospitality & Catering and Construction. These subjects will set homework in accordance with the issuing of assignment tasks. Students will be given a set amount of time in which to complete these assignments and therefore may be issued on different days as it is dependent upon the current teaching topic.
