



INFPs are idealistic, flexible minds that always see the good in people. They are gentle, kind and open-minded, and their friends will find them a calming influence that they can tell anything to without judgement. They tend to be more interested in ideas and making people happy than in practical solutions, and they are good at understanding what others are feeling.

INFPs are very curious and like to explore new things. They have lots of ideas and are very creative, especially in domains that let you create a fantasy world like writing, poetry or music. They are responsive to beauty and imagery, and often talk in metaphors to express their feelings. INFPs take a lot of pleasure in their creativity, and they love to encourage others to follow suit. When they are working on something they care about they are passionate and dedicated, but they find it hard to make themselves focus on work they don't enjoy.

INFPs don't care about traditions or accepted opinions, preferring to understand what is important to them. They stay very true to their own ideals, and feel strongly about things. They are generally optimistic but can get overwhelmed when things pile up, for example feeling helpless in the face of climate change, or getting stressed by a mountain of things to do (especially as they can be a bit impractical). They can become exhausted if they concentrate on too many things at once, and this is the case with people too. Because they care so deeply about their relationships, INFPs often find it hard to balance too many close friendships.

Sensitive and prone to taking criticism personally, INFPs prefer to be reserved when they first meet someone, so they can be protective of their ideas. This means that it can take a while to get to know them, but once they make a friend, an INFP will consider this friendship for life.
